Army Integrated Family Support Network, working in concert with other military and civilian agencies, is intended to establish a comprehensive multi-agency approach for community support and service to meet the diverse needs of the Active Army, Army National Guard, and Army Reserve Soldiers, Families and Employers throughout the entire deployment cycle
